A big 'welcome back' to all of our returning pupils and a big 'welcome' to our new Reception children. It is lovely to see you all following the 6 week break.

There are a few changes to things, which I will outline below, but what remains is our drive and passion to work with you to deliver the best education to your children. OFSTED

It seems an age ago since we had the inspection, but I have now received our official report which is available for you to view on our website by following the link below (About Us/Key Information):

Naturally we are very pleased with the outcomes, showing that we are operating at the expected standard in every area of the inspection criteria. The inspection is no longer a 'best fit' based - all bullet points have to be met in each area, so we were disappointed to not achieve the 'strong' grading in two areas as we missed by one bullet point in each set of criteria.

The framework has changed significantly since our last inspection in 2021 with much more focus on leadership, routines, procedures, progress and inclusion. Every angle was scrutinised by the inspectors, leaving no stone unturned and it was a tiring two days for everyone.

Inspectors commented that 'staff know pupils well, which helps pupils feel that they belong' and this sits perfectly alongside our school vision of 'family' which was also recognised in the church school inspection we had in February. Inspectors were impressed with the excellent start the children get in EYFS and they could see the progress they made through the school due to a purposeful, accessible curriculum, effective teaching, inclusive practice to give all children the chance of success and a clear understanding of pupil wellbeing.

Our Diocesan representative who attended the final briefing said to me that it was 'unusual' for a school to be expected in all areas, as there are usually one or two areas that Ofsted would mark down due to lack of evidence.

We have a couple of targets, as expected, which we will be working on directly through the new School Development Plan which we will be putting together over the next few weeks.

Can I, once again, thank the parents who spoke to the inspectors on either of the two days or completed the online parent survey forms. Your support for, and kind words about, the school were much appreciated.

Hopefully, when you read the report, it will further show that your children are in good hands, being cared for, supported and challenged by people who care.

We are determined to keep working hard to make Navenby even better in all areas and look forward to working with you through 2026/27.

CHURCH

We continue to work with our friends from St Peter's Church who support with collective worship, special church events and events in school.

Rev Susan retired last summer and so we are delighted to be welcoming Canon Kathryn and Helen Gardner to help lead collective worships on Tuesdays alongside our Bishop's Visitor, Mrs Cawthorne. Rev Stuart is taking a short break but will hopefully return in the near future.

Mr Housam will also be in school again this year leading collective worship, on behalf of the Joy Foundation once a month, and supporting and developing RE and our church school ethos through his role as Foundation Governor. He will also be helping our new collective worship councillors when they have been selected.

GOVERNORS

Our Governors will continue to work hard behind the scenes, looking at the strategic direction of the school and monitoring the quality of provision, particularly focusing on safeguarding, finance and inclusion. Our Governing Body consist of the following people with their responsibilities shown in brackets:

Mr Canadine (the LA representative) resigned from his position, due to work commitments, in the summer term and so we are looking to find a suitable replacement. If you know

anyone who would like to be put forward to fulfil this role, then please do come and speak to me in school about it.

If you feel you could help out in any respect with any elements of their role, I know the Governors responsible would be delighted to hear from you. Contact with them can be made through me via the school email or phone call. Our strategic plan is available for parents to view on our website.

BEHAVIOUR

Today I reminded the children of our behaviour expectations.

- One-offs and 'minor' poor behaviour choices, which we all make from time-to-time are dealt with by the adult in the child's classroom.
- Repetitive poor behaviour choices or more serious ones will be escalated to the key Stage leads: Mr Swain for KS1 and Miss Sheardown for KS2.
- If behaviour choices don't improve or the behaviour is deemed deliberately hurtful or defiant then it will be escalated to Miss Sheardown in her capacity as deputy head.
- And finally, if any behaviours are completely unacceptable or consistent to a daily basis and children have not responded to guidance and advice then I will be involved. If it gets to this level, then please assume (if you are contacted by me) that the matter is a serious one-off incident or your child has been through our behaviour procedure.

Depending on the nature of the behaviour, stages can be bypassed if the staff feel it necessary. All poor behaviour choices are recorded on our internal system (CPOMS) which myself and Miss Reeder, in her capacity as safeguarding lead, see. Likewise any behaviour incidents in Key Stage 1 will be seen by Mr Swain and any in KS2 will be seen by Miss Sheardown.

The behaviour of the children is usually excellent with matters not going beyond the Key Stage leads. Hopefully this structure will help you and the children see how and why things may be escalated if necessary.

As always, we appreciate you speaking to your children about making good choices and being respectful to everyone in school.

MARKING

We will be shortly updating our marking policy to reflect the recent discussions we have had on INSET Day about teacher workload.

In summary (although the full policy will be available following approval at the Governors' meeting):

- Teachers and teaching assistants will be using 'rapid feedback' more widely in lessons; this involves speaking to children and addressing misconceptions within the lesson. This will be denoted by a D in a circle in books.
- If, following evidence gathering (including observations, verbal responses and work in books), the adult feels the child has understood the learning a tick will be placed by the learning objective.
- A series of lines looking like steps will be used to denote that the child needs to go back and correct something fundamental in their work (such as spellings, grammar or a misconception); it will also be used to ask children who are showing a particular love for the learning (for example greater depth pupils) to carry out an extension task.
- Teachers will mark work in blue pen and children will use purple pens for editing or self-marking.

All work will continue to be looked at and valued by staff who may want to add things beyond the minimum expectations above. By alerting you to this change now, it will hopefully avoid any questions at parents' evenings when it may look like teachers haven't 'marked' the children's work.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

Once again, we will be putting on a variety of after school clubs which we hope children will want to join. Staff kindly give up their time freely to run these clubs purely for the benefit of the children. Please can I ask that you communicate with us if your child no longer wishes to attend a club (particularly if numbers are limited) or they are going to miss a club for any reason. We need to know children are safe and if they are not where they are meant to be we have to investigate. Children must not just walk off home at the end of the day if they don't feel like attending the club that night. This could lead to the child being asked to leave the club permanently.

Any child that is permitted to walk home on their own after the club should have the necessary form completed for them by their parents. The 'permission to walk home' form is available from the school office or on the website.

We expect the same behaviour standards at clubs as in school. Please remind your child to be courteous and respectful to any adult leading the clubs. Thank you.
