



Home-school Agreement (from 2025)

The school will:

- Care for the child's safety, health and happiness at school following the Christian ethos of the school
- Use data effectively to ensure that the child achieves his/her full potential and is a valued member of the school community.
- Inform parents about the curriculum learning each term and provide guidance about how parents can help at home.
- Inform parents of children's progress at parents' consultation evenings each term and through the annual report.
- Provide clear guidance on expectations including behaviour and academic standards so children can aspire and be ambitious.
- Challenge under-performance and praise all children for effort and a good attitude to learning.
- Provide and deliver, through high quality teaching, an exciting, motivating curriculum to engage all learners so they are suitably challenged and successful.

The family will:

- Make sure their child arrives at school on time, dressed in the correct uniform and prepared for the school day.
- Make sure their child attends regularly and provides a note of explanation if they are absent.
- Make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect their child's work or behaviour.
- Support all the school's policies and guidelines (particularly for behaviour) which are accessible on the school website.
- Support their child in homework tasks and other opportunities for home learning.
- Attend all open evenings and other school events, including Church festivals, where possible.
- Park with care and attention with regard to road safety around the school.

The children will:

- Look after each other.
- Set high expectations for themselves and take ownership of their learning.
- Do all their class work and homework to the best of their ability, taking pride in what they are doing.
- Be polite and helpful to others and respect their opinions and feelings.
- Take good care of the equipment, building and grounds and keep the school litter free.
- Talk to teachers/parents/carers if they are unhappy at school.
- Wear the school uniform, remember PE kit and be tidy in appearance.

Together we will:

- Set appropriately high expectations and encourage children to work independently to the best of their ability so that good progress is being made.
- Identify and cater for children's individual needs so all aspects of the curriculum can be accessed.
- Build a good level of communication between school, family and child so everyone feels valued and supported.
- All behave appropriately (in school and the local community), model good practice and develop a sense of responsibility for each other.
- Show respect in the way we communicate, speak calmly and professionally to resolve any issues and not take to social media to air negative feelings about individuals or the school.
